Compuestos de "some, any, no"

	-body	-one	-thing
some	somebody	someone	something
any	anybody	anyone	anything
no	nobody	no one	nothing

Nota

Los *pronombres indefinidos compuestos* siguen las mismas reglas de *some, any, no*.

Somebody – someone – something se usan en frases *afirmativas*, y en frases *interrogativas* cuando se ofrece o se pide algo.

- > There is **somebody/someone** in the house.
 - I'm very thirsty. Can I have **something** to drink?
 - Of course. Would you like **something** to eat too? You must also be hungry.

Anybody – anyone – anything se usan en frases *negativas* e *interrogativas*.

- > There isn't **anybody/anyone** in the house.
 - Is there **anybody/anyone** in the garden?

Basic English Grammar

En frases afirmativas **anybody** – **anyone** – **anything** tienen el significado de **cualquier, cualquiera, cualquier cosa**.

> **Anybody** can learn a foreign language, but motivation is a key factor.

When you are young, you think you can do **anything**.

Nota

somewhere = en alguna parte, en algún sitio

anywhere = en cualquier parte (con un verbo negativo)

nowhere = en ninguna parte (con un verbo afirmativo)

everywhere = en todas partes

everybody = todos

everyone = todo el mundo

everything = todo

¡Atención!

Everybody y **everyone** significan "todos", pero llevan el verbo al singular.

> Is **everybody** ready for dinner?
