1. **either** = *uno u otro (cualquiera de los dos)*

- > - Excuse me. Which is the road to the airport, the one on the right, or the one on the left?  
- You can go by **either** road.

*En lugar de decir:* You can go by **either** road.

*se puede decir:* You can go by **either of** the roads.

2. **either** = *el uno y el otro - ambos*

- > He kissed her on **either** cheek. (= on **both** cheeks)

*Con las palabras: side = lado o end = extremidad*

- > There are always cars parked on **either side** of the street.  
On weekends there are traffic policemen at **either end** of the tunnel.

3. **not... either** = *ni uno - ni otro*

- > Margaret likes cats and dogs, but Tom does **not** like **either**.

4. **not... either** = *tampoco*

- > Lydia doesn't like football, and she doesn't like boxing **either**.

5. **either... or** = *o... o*

- > Margaret wants to keep **either** a dog **or** a cat.  
Abel wants to spend his summer holidays **either** in Spain **or** in America.  
At meal times Tom likes to drink **either** beer **or** red wine.

6. **neither** = *ni uno ni otro* - *ninguno de los dos*

- > - Which pet animal does Tom want to keep, a dog or a cat?  
- I think he wants to keep **neither**.  
*o bien:*  
- I think he wants to keep **neither of them**.

7. **neither... nor** = *ni ... ni*

- > Margaret **neither** drinks **nor** smokes.

**Neither** my father **nor** my mother smokes.

Those who would give up essential Liberty  
to purchase a little temporary Safety,  
deserve **neither** Liberty **nor** Safety.
